President's Report

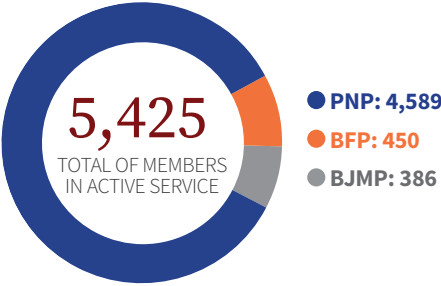


We all know that the past years has been a test of the Lakan's will, and on behalf of the Philippine National Police Academy Alumni Association Inc. (PNPAAAI), I am proud of every Lakan's story of triumph and success. It is the product of how our Alma Mater has trained us which enables us to rise from any circumstances.

The PNPA Alumni Association made efforts to have its presence felt by the Lakan in every way possible. For the year 2021, the Association has conducted several ways to add significant value to our Alma Mater and the alumni members assigned in Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao. Moreover, the Association made leaps of changes to better improve its services for the welfare of all the alumni members. The changes taking place at PNPAAAI focuses on the following aspects:

- ✓ Accounting of all the regular and adopted members;
- ✓ Scholarship to Emerging Leaders Fellowship to 10 Lakans;
- ✓ Becoming a Host and Chairman of the Assembly of Service Academies and Schools Alumni Association of the Philippines;
- ✓ Swift disbursement of Financial Assistance like Burial Assistance, Medical Assistance, Educational Assistance, and even Calamity Assistance for the Lakan who were victims of TD Odette;
- ✓ Release of Bureau Fund and Regional Fund to 3 Bureaus and 17 Chapters;
- ✓ Release of PNPA Fund Support;
- ✓ Repair of the PNPAAAI office inside PNPA and the PNPA Gymnasium;
- ✓ Conduct of *Kumustahan ng mga Lakan* via online platform.

As of this writing, a total of **5,425 PNPA Alumni are in active service** out of 6,952 graduates from 1980 to the present: **4,589** from the Philippine National Police, **386** from the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology, and **450** from the Bureau of Fire Protection. On the other hand, there are a total of **1,424 Adopted Members** and **36 Honorary Members**.

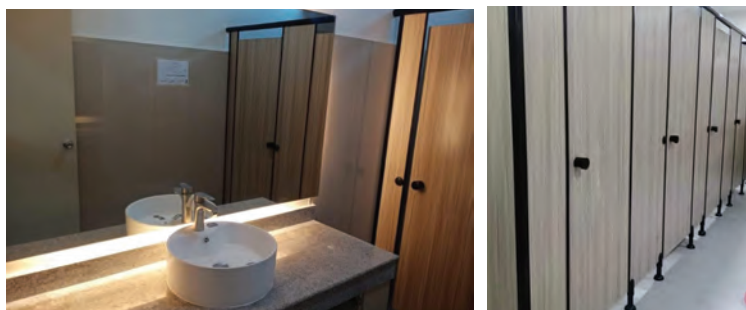

As the Lakans continue to reach the top post and create their distinction in the respective bureaus/service, this 2021, there are **52 Lakans who got promoted to star rank** — 45 from PNP, 1 from BJMP, and 6 from BFP.

Continuous efforts are being coordinated with the PNPA and the Bureau Chapters, Regional Chapters, and Class Presidents to know and maintain the accurate status of every Lakan to determine our total strength. Moreover, the Association is working on a website portal and an alumni membership ID (see story at PNPAAAI in action on page 17).

Additionally, the Association has released a total of **5.3 million** under the Morale and Welfare Committee the primary purpose of which is to give assistance. Last 2021, the Association gave assistance to 88 Lakans—29 Burial Assistance, 50 Medical Assistance, and 9 Educational Assistance.

Aside from the assistance given to the bureaus and regions, on October 26, 2021, the Association also released a total of P660,000 to PNPA as its Fund Support to help the Academy towards achieving its goals and objectives.

In December 2021, the Philippines was hardly hit by Typhoon Odette which caused great damage in the regions Visayas Region. It has come to the attention of the Association that some Lakans were affected by the onslaught of the typhoon. In response, the Association released P15,000 each to 28 Lakans.

While the Association is moving forward, on behalf of the BOT and the Alumni, we never forget to take care of our Alma Mater. In fact, the Association initiated the repair of the PNPA Gymnasium during the PNPA Donor's Forum to show our unwavering support to the modernization project of the Academy.

I believe that all that is written here were a product of a united Lakan. In 2021, a series of *Kumustahan ng mga Lakan* was initiated to get the updates and address the concerns of alumni members in every bureau.

I want you to know that we are not just simply moving on - there is still so much important work ahead for all of us at PNPA. As Lakans, we are committed to making sure the improvements and best practices will be sustained.

Finally, Lakans, thank you for your continued support and participation as we move forward, especially during this time of pandemic on how we do things has evolved. I take pride in all our daily efforts, small and big achievements and sense of purpose to fulfill our sworn duty to enhance the Academy and the alumni member's impact and imprint across the country and beyond—for love of God and country.

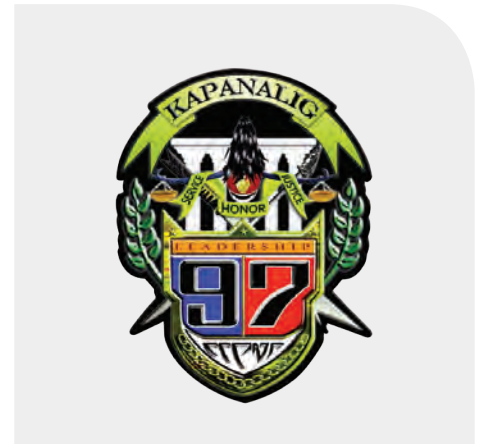

Lakan Distinguished Award

The highest award granted to deserving PNPA Alumni for their exceptional administrative or operational accomplishment or for being recipients of any of the following prestigious awards: Lingkod Bayan Award; Dangal ng Bayan Award; Ten Outstanding Policeman of the Philippines (TOPP); Country's Outstanding Police Officers in Service (COPS); Ten Outstanding Firemen of the Year, Ten Outstanding Pillars of Justice; Outstanding Career Executive Service Officers of the Year and other equally outstanding awards in public service which the Committee may determine.



Lakan Achievement Award

An award granted to deserving Alumni who are designated/appointed to the highest position in the tri-bureau, i.e., Chiefs of the Philippine National Police, Bureau of the Fire Protection and Bureau of the Jail Management and Penology.



Lakan Special Award

An award given to alumni who are elected or appointed to a local or national positions, i.e., at least mayor for elective positions and at least Director IV or any position with at least Salary Grade 28 for appointive offices.



Lakan Service Award

An award given to retiring Alumni for their faithful service in their respective bureau of assignment and to all outgoing Board of Trustees members who have meritoriously served the PNAAAI BOT.



Lakan Duty Award

An award given to Alumni who have been assigned for at least two (2) years at the Philippine National Police Academy, whose Performance Evaluation Rating is at least Very Satisfactory.



Honorary/Adopted/Associate Lakan Award

An award given to deserving PNPAAI honorary, adopted, or associate members for having demonstrated exemplary performance in their respective fields or professionals that greatly contributed to the accomplishment of the overall goal and objectives of the PNPAAI.



Lakan Recognition Award

An award given to a non-member individual for demonstrated meritorious services to the PNPAAI and PNPA or for personifying or promoting the Academy's ideals of Justice, Integrity and Service.



Lakan Class Award

An award given to deserving PNPA host classes for having hosted or sponsored a particular alumni homecoming or related event.

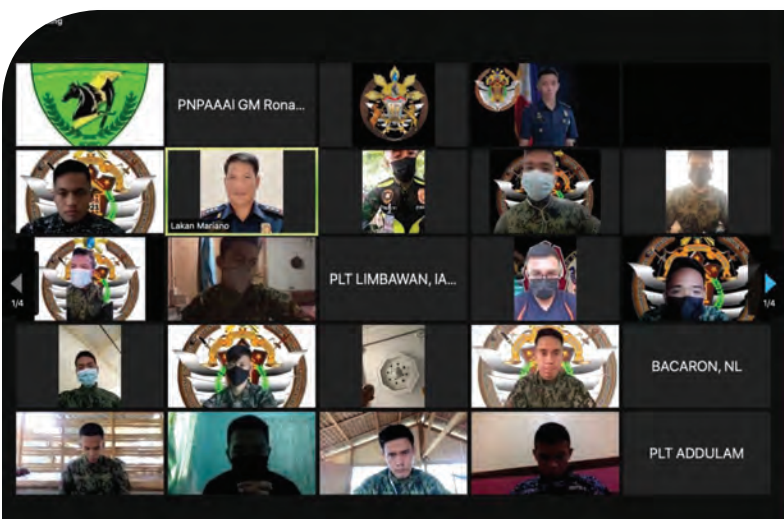

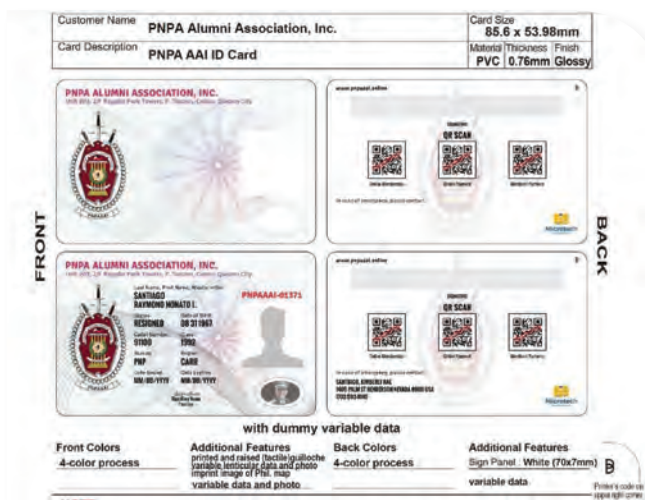

JSINSP LOBENIA indeed showed selflessness and compassion, devoting himself to ripple positive transformations in the lives of the least, the lost, and the last, to those who are no longer a threat but an asset to the nation. Truly, he is a LAKAN worth our adulation and emulation.

Service Beyond Excellence

Know the Story of One of the METROBANK Foundation's Most Outstanding Filipino for 2021

Police Lieutenant Colonel Gerard Ace Jumawan Pelare is the 2021 Metrobank Outstanding Filipino Awardee and is currently the Campus Director of National Police College 7. He grew up to adversities and painful realities which drove him to aim high and reach for his dreams. He was born in Sapang Dalaga, Misamis Occidental on September 18, 1984. At the age of seven, he lost his mother to breast cancer. The loss devastated the young Gerard, yet again the wheels of fate turned and played against him when the following year his father remarried. The development posed a challenge in the direction of his life, which forced him to seek help from his relatives to fulfill his dreams. His uncles and aunts were instrumental in the realization of his dreams when they supported him in his studies and achieved the highest honor when he graduated valedictorian in elementary and high school from Baliangao Central School and Pulot National High School. In 2003, Gerard entered the service as a cadet of the Philippine National Police Academy (PNPA) and earned his bachelor's degree. As a highly motivated cadet, he became the Vice-Chairman of the Honor Committee and a Battalion Operations Officer. The challenges of his childhood did not hinder this resilient man to become what he is now.

PLTCOL Pelare has held six posts as Chief of Police in Cebu Police Provincial Office, PRO7. In his last two assignments in Danao City Police Station and Consolacion Police Station, he authored **Oplan Limpyo, a comprehensive fight against illegal drugs and crimes, which gained prominence and admiration in Central Visayas.** He drove excellence and work ethics among police officers, making these two units as the Best Component City Police Station and Best Municipal Police Station in 2017 and 2018, respectively in Police Regional Office 7.

His stint in Consolacion made him the Best Junior Police Commissioned Officer for Operations in Police Regional Office 7 during the 117th Police Service Anniversary and the Best Junior Police Commissioned Officer for Police Community Relations in the same year. In his analytical and comprehensive fight against illegal drugs through Oplan Limpyo Lacion, he and his team arrested Jocelyn Encila and her parents in a buy-bust operation which yielded **10 kilograms of shabu.** They took the fight a mile farther when he coordinated with the Anti-Money Laundering Council for the freezing of the drug money and properties of the suspect. Unprecedented in Central Visayas, his team was able to secure a **Court Freeze Order of the suspects'**

assets amounting to 30 million pesos. Subsequently, in a Sangguniang Bayan Resolution, PLTCOL Pelare was declared an **Adopted Son of Consolacion**, a manifestation of hard work, competence, and integrity in the field of public service and as a way of showing the sincere gratitude of the people of the Municipality of Consolacion for his unwavering passion to serve.

PLTCOL Pelare is also a lawyer who took the grueling Bar Examinations twice. In 2014, he finished a Bachelor of Laws and immediately took the bar exams, but fate was not in his favor when he flunked that year. His failure motivated him to strive harder in his review, he intensely burned his midnight candles to attain his ultimate life goal. Lo and behold his determination paid off when he passed the Bar Exams in 2016 where he got an average rating of **83.35%.** Notable was his rating in **Criminal Law, which was pegged at 98%.**

His drive for excellence as a born leader has led him to become the **founding Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Lakans of Central Visayas Incorporated**, the association of all PNPA alumni in Central Visayas, and served the same post for three years. He was also voted in 2018 as the Chairman of the Board of Directors for Cebu Police Provincial Office Cooperative, a

cooperative which seeks to advance the welfare of CPPO personnel. Gerard - in his passion to serve - has also organized the retirees in his first place of assignment in Asturias Cebu where he now resides with his wife Armida and two daughters, Patricia Louise and Helena Gracia.

As the **Chief of Police of Talisay City Police Station**, he has again led the unit to become the Best Component City Police Station in 2020 during the 119th Police Service Anniversary and the Police Community Relations Month in Police Regional Office 7. Truly, he always brings the best out of the units he leads and inspires excellence in the performance of police functions. From being a dreaded area in illegal drugs having been mentioned by PRRD a number of times, he was able, through **Oplan Limpyo Talisay**, to turn the place into a model City in confronting the menace of illegal drugs by a more effective platform.

In his relentless fight against illegal drug personalities, his unit arrested a total of 784 illegal drug suspects, confiscated a total of 7,325 grams of illegal drugs with an estimated street value of 49 million pesos since his assumption last October 2019, the most in PRO 7 among all component city police stations. He has maximized community participation and active involvement towards cleansing the City from illegal drug use and trade, partnered with the local government unit and other agencies, built comfort rooms for communities, and introduced community-based programs aimed at bringing the government to the people. He also coined his **Balik-Armas Project**, a community-based undertaking of employing diplomacy and effective communication in generating the mass surrender of **132** firearms and counting.

These activities combined have brought light to the City of Talisay, which

is now considered as one of the most peaceful cities in Central Visayas based on the number of crime occurrences and illegal drug affectation. His unconventional approach against illegal drugs, through **Oplan Limpyo**, has already led to the arrest to close to two thousand drug personalities and accounting for more than a hundred million worth of illegal drugs, without a single human rights violation.

The advent of the Covid-19 virus led the Nominee to introduce tailored-fit strategies to prevent the spread of the virus which hit the City of Talisay badly in the initial months of the pandemic. PLTCOL Pelare made sure that all the 169 police officers under him are all competent **contact-tracing-trained under the John Hopkins University**, which implemented a no non-sense campaign to implement the IATAF guidelines. This accounted for a total of 5904 violators arrested and charged and helped ease overcrowding through the **Pulis na Palenghero Project**, where police officers offer marketing services for free to prevent exposure to the virus. From more than a thousand active cases, the City of Talisay has trimmed it down to less than 20 active cases.

PLTCOL Pelare has pioneered groundbreaking programs that created an impact in the community and among police officers. In his pursuit to establish a professional, competent and operationally proficient unit, he implemented the **City of Talisay Police Station Service Golden Rules**, a guide for the police officers in their daily performance of duty as a result of which, his unit was awarded during the recent **PNP Ethics Day Celebration in PRO 7**. His experience as a young boy has moved him to create **POLICE P.A.C.K.S.** He firmly believes that helping the kids whose parents are engaged in drugs and jailed through education and kindness will

take them out of the streets and become good citizens. The program builds their characters and aims to end the vicious cycle of falling victims to illegal drugs. This innovation in service is novel since Gerard tapped private sponsors through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to institutionalize the project.

As a well-rounded officer, he has dedicated community service in order to balance police operations. He instituted **ITANONG KAY ATTY TSIP**, a service he pays forward to police officers and indigent families who are in dire need of legal advice and services for free.

A young boy from Mindanao has transformed himself to be a catalyst of change. The obstacles he met have inspired him to make a difference in society. It was once his dream to capture criminals and bring them to justice, and now it has become a reality. A reality that he has lived and breathed. His guidance has inspired police officers to live up to the core values of Talisay City PNP which are **Leadership, Excellence, and Humility**. A leader who always makes a difference in all his assignments by and through sincere and wholehearted delivery of police services.

The opportunities given to him have been put to good use. True enough, he is a servant of the law. Even with the successes he has reached, he remains to be modest and has never forgotten where he has begun. A testament to his humility is his ability to allow others to shine and recognize their milestone. He lives by his promise of giving back to the people through kindness and PAYING IT FORWARD to strangers and friends alike.

An Epitome of Excellence

Jorge Antonio Perez Bustos finished his degree in Criminology, Magna Cum Laude, from Angeles University Foundation (AUF), and was the Corps Commander of the Reserved Officer Training Corps (ROTC) of the said university.

After graduation, he traversed through his faith and entered the Philippine National Police Academy (PNPA) to pursue a degree in Public Safety and became a commissioned officer of the Philippine National Police (PNP). It was in the august halls of PNPA where the strongest sense of patriotism and public service was instilled in him. Being the leader that he is, he was elected and served as the Class President of PNPA’s KAAGAPAY Class of 1996. He also became the Platoon Leader of the Slow Drill Platoon of PNPA, the First and Only Slow Drill Platoon in Asia.

Congressman Jorge “PATROL” Bustos, relentless in his quest for knowledge and learning, pursued post-graduate studies and garnered his Master in Public Administration from Angeles University Foundation

and Master in Public Management from the Development Academy of the Philippines (DAP).

He then earned the rank of Police Lieutenant Colonel (PLTCOL) in the PNP prior to his election as a member of the House of Representatives, 18TH Congress of the Republic of the Philippines.

He also received the Layman Award from the Department of Education, Culture, and Sports (DECS) in recognition of his support for the programs and projects of the said agency. Jorge also received leadership awards from the Development Academy of the Philippines and the Public Safety Senior Executive Course. And in 2020, he was hailed Hero of the Year

2020, for his impeccable performance in the field of public service during the time of a pandemic, given by the Gawad Filipino Awards.

A Champion of the Public Safety Advocacy

As the son of a commissioned public safety professional, Jorge was accustomed to the vision of ensuring safe and secure communities for the Filipino people. After years of serving as a police officer in the Philippine National Police, he realized that his post was only a stepping stone towards fulfilling a larger goal. With the help and inspiration of his trusted colleagues, friends, and emboldened constituents, he believed in his vision and collective undertaking, and eventually instituted the Public Safety Alliance for Transformation and Rule of Law, Inc., succinctly called PATROL, into the Party-List that we all know today.

The Public Safety Alliance for Transformation and Rule Of Law Inc., succinctly known as PATROL, is an organization conceptualized in 2015 by the shared vision

of public safety practitioners, educators, lawyers, businessmen, professionals, and volunteers whose hearts and minds are united in their desire to ensure the safety of lives and protection of properties towards empowered citizenry in a peaceful and sustainable community. The organization aspires for every household to enjoy safe, secure, and peaceful communities, free from terrorism and criminality. As disasters, both man-made and natural, are also a threat to public safety, the coverage of the organization’s movement subsequently expanded to address terrorism, criminality, and disasters.

PATROL believes that people empowerment through family inclusion leads to a stronger republic. PATROL’s desire is to inculcate in every family and each of its individual members the aspiration, inspiration, and motivation to be vigilant with the emphasis on personal discipline, “*bayanihan*”, volunteerism, and genuine concern for our countrymen moving towards its fundamental goal of safer and more secure communities for every Filipino family. PATROL plans to reach a wider sphere of impact and so deemed it timely to register as a Sectoral Organization under the Party-List System of Representation in order to expand its influence and utilize its members’ efforts in a nationwide crusade. PATROL’s legislative agenda is geared towards strengthening and capacitating the capabilities of all public safety practitioners and every Filipino family in order to realize its collective vision of empowered Filipino families practicing public safety as their way of life by providing fair opportunities, just provisions, and equal access to security measures. PATROL Party-List shall be the catalyst for transforming communities into peaceful, safe, progressive, and disaster-resilient havens.

A Representative of the People

In all of his speeches and public pronouncements, he makes sure to emphasize that his commitment to serve the country and its people is deeply rooted in his training from the Academy and his passion to lead is an attribute that he developed as a Lakan.

Congressman PATROL Bustos vows that he will never depart from the values that the Philippine National Police Academy stands for; Justice, Integrity, and Service. He will always strive to be a Beacon of Truth, Bearer of Impartiality, and Trailblazer of Genuine Volunteerism.

Reminiscing Cadetship

It was on October 15, 1994, that tens of thousands of applicants for cadetship program of PNPA proceeded to the different designated testing locations nationwide, purposely to undergo the written examination. Out of this number, eight hundred hopefuls were notified to continue for the next step of becoming a cadet.

Series of physical, medical, mental and emotional examinations followed from January to February 1995. On June 1, 1995, the two hundred fifty applicants who successfully passed all the series of tests that was conducted by the PNP Health Service reported to PNPA grounds, Camp Mariano N Castaneda, Silang, Cavite to start the Cadetship Program. Additional nineteen reported on later days. This is because some of the cadets have resigned or did not opt to continue the training due to personal reasons. In the morning of that fateful day, which is the start of our cadetship program, we were guided to the parade grounds which they called the "hallowed ground." We were dressed in maong pants and white tee shirts and lined up at the far end of the ground. We were also grouped into six companies, from Alfa to Foxtrot. After several preliminaries and marchings of the Class 1996, we were gracefully received. The ceremonial skirmish was the start of our molding into what the Institution wants us to be.

After the ceremonies, we were ushered to the kitchen which they called the "mess hall." After which, we went to the Gymnasium as our temporary house; as we were yet to incorporate to the senior cadets. They call our dwelling as the "melting pot." In that abode, we were given different outfits for cadets. We now realize

that we are no longer civilians because we were led to a regimented life that nobody liked and expected. We act and move by the number, from the moment we wake up in the early morning until we retire in the late evening. In the classrooms, we studied different subjects and disciplines in order to achieve the degree of Bachelor of Science in Public Safety.

July 1, 1995 was our Incorporation Day. We packed our belongings, crossed the Horseshoe Drive and transferred to the barracks of the Kaagapay Class 1996. That was the start of the true reformation of our personality and mind set. After almost six arduous months of marching, studies and physical conditionings, on January 27, 1996, we again lined up on the hallowed ground for our recognition day. This was the first time that our upperclassmen gave their much desired and coveted handshake. This gesture was very much meaningful to us because we offered our sweat, tears, blood and life just to be recognized by our seniors. This was also the first time that the famous "Silent Drill Company" displayed their prowess in rifle drills to the public.

On April 18, 1996, the Kaagapay Class 1996 graduated from the Academy. They were commissioned as Inspectors to different uniformed bureaus of the DILG. They left us a legacy that worthy of emulation; to become a better person and leader. This time, we are on our own.

We were left with a promise to ourselves that we will carry the name of PNPA with utmost discipline and professionalism.

The summer of 1996 was a busy period of the year. We had our Field Training Exercises at the PNPA ground. The culmination of which was our force march from PNPA to Nasugbu, Batangas. The sixty five kilometer hike cry challenging because we have to carry a load of fifteen kilograms of personal belongings for one week of bivouac. The weight doesn't include our rifles and donned fatigue uniforms.

May 1, 1996, cadets of Class 1998 had their Reception on the same hallowed ground. We did what the Class 96 did to us. We received them with gusto and vigor. We passed unto them what our upperclassmen have taught us. As days go by, we have been preparing to be leaders. We were honed to become what we were assumed to be. Even though we play different roles in the Academy, we are destined to be Officers; which is a hard task. We underwent series of trainings, lessons and educations until we were complete to become competent, reliable, dependable, trustworthy and responsible leaders, come graduation day.

April 25, 1997 was the most awaited day of our lives as cadets. This was our graduation day. This is the day where we have realized our dreams of becoming Police/Fire/Jail Commissioned Officers. We have successfully finished the Bachelor of Science in Public Safety. This is also the start of a new chapter of our lives. This time, we are individually on our own. We can no longer have our cadet buddies to accompany us in times of sufferings. This is the time where our aspirations has been realized; to become leaders of men.

He was born from a family of military officers who raised him to exude discipline in any dimensions of life. With the guidance of his elder brother, the late MSGT Nelson F Petalio of the Philippine Air Force who was assigned at the 205th Tactical Helicopter Wing helped him financed his education while he worked as a matadero at night and a butcher during daytime in the public market at Gate 3, Bonifacio Minimart in Taguig City for 5 years. He continued this job to fund him as he was enrolled in BS Aircraft Maintenance Engineering. Eventually, with the divine intervention for his never-ending prayer, he passed and entered the prestigious institution of Philippine National Police Academy to fulfill his lifelong mission which is to serve the country. As a cadet, he demonstrated his competence as a leader, earning him the position of a Battalion Commander. merit, medals, and awards. He is a Top 3 Contender in National Level—Best Senior PCO for Operations and Special Unit Award for his Accomplishment on Tokhang Activities (Regional Level) from PRO CALABARZON during the 119th Police Service Anniversary.

His notable accomplishments include Medalya ng Pambihirang Paglilingkod for his eminently meritorious and invaluable service rendered as Provincial Director, Laguna Police Provincial Office from 2019-2021. He was also the Chief of Regional Intelligence

Division, PRO CALABARZON from 2018 to 2019; He was designated as Chief of Police of Biñan City Police Station from November 15, 2015, to April 7, 2016 wherein the unit was adjudged as the Best Anti-Illegal Drugs Task Force Nationwide. He also became the Chief of Police, Cainta CPS and Antipolo CPS from 2015-2018. He was the Training Director of Institute Training Group (ITG), National Police Training Institute (NPTI) from 2011 to 2013 wherein he was adjudged as the Best Regional Training Director nationwide. He was the Commandant for the National Forensic Training Institute (NFSTI) from 2010 to 2011 wherein he was adjudged as the Junior Officer of the Year. He was the Chief of Covert Escort Security Service, National Air Carrier (CESSNA)/ PNP Air Marshall Program of Aviation Security Group from 2005 to 2009 where he was the Chief CESSNA next to then PSUPT RONALD “BATO” DELA ROSA. He received a United Nations (UN) Service Medal where he was assigned at the Philippine

and 2021. Gen Mariano Castaneda Award and LAKAN Distinguished Award 2020 was also awarded to the nominee. In addition to this, he is a recipient of the Outstanding Achievement Medal. Further, he has a total of eleven (11) Medalya ng Kadakilaan wherein one of which is for the saving of the lives of PGEN ARCHIE GAMBOA and eight others from a helicopter crash, thirty (30) Medalya ng Kagalingan, various military

Contingent to the United Nations Mission in Kosovo (UNMIK) and become a member of the elite Close Protection Unit Special Operations Group who secured VIPs like judges and prosecutors and other dignitaries from 2000 to 2001.

Amongst his achievements, he is a licensed helicopter pilot and an aircraft mechanic (Airframe/Power plant). He is also the *Founder of Lakan Kalis Philippines*. His best attribute is his capacity to lead, where one of his notable projects include leading the joint initiatives for peace and security particularly for the anti-terrorism campaign, UPLB-PNP, which had created the “UPLB Ko, Bantay Ko” Program, the Workers Union-PNP Accord, and inter-government agencies effort in relation to Executive Order Number 70. While he was the Chief RID, PRO CALABARZON from 2018 to 2020.

As the Training Director of the Institute Training Group, PCOL PETALIO II formulated the idea of Philippine Public Safety College (PPSC) Lakan-Kali version, wherein this form of martial arts was institutionalized in the Philippine National Police Academy. The goal of this project is to educate the officers with close-quarter combat skills that are integral in their duties as members of law enforcement. The Philippine Public Safety College has included Pekiti Tirsia Lakan Kali System in the program of instruction in all regional training centers nationwide, in the curriculum of the Philippine National Police Academy (PNPA), and other constituent units that advocates for an original Filipino martial arts program as part of their law enforcement skills in public safety functions. PCOL PETALIO II also initiated the construction of the ITG Grandstand and the NPTI Firing Range in the Philippine Public Safety College (PPSC) beneficial to the institution and its students.

His exceptional operational accomplishments includes the fight against the CTG's and the conduct of Anti-illegal drug operations against Joeffer Alba y Abdul, HVI, member of Fajardo Criminal Gang a big-time drug pusher who was responsible behind illegal drugs supplies in Taguig, Metro Manila and several municipalities and jails of Laguna Province; also the conduct of Anti-Illegal Drugs Operation (Buy-Bust) for Violation of RA 9165 at Brgy

Dayap Calauan, Laguna which resulted in Armed Encounter against Adam Quin Villanueva y Balderada (Deceased) male, 35 years old, jobless and a Member of Amante Drug Group.

The accomplishment of Sitio Kapayapaan, A Precursor to Project SIKAP (Ang Uring Pinagmulan) an Effort to Neutralize Local Armed Conflict, PCOL PETALIO II has executed a system that resulted in the construction of a peaceful community where former rebels can thrive as they integrate themselves back into society. In January 2021, PNP Chief Gen. Debold Sinas concluded that capitulation of the 97 rebels was a “living testament of how the whole-of-nation approach had become a success. Project SIKAP led to the accomplishment of NTF-ELCAC in CALABARZON because of its sustainable approach in retaining former rebels. The established community of former rebels in Kalayaan, Laguna continues to shelter its beneficiaries and remains to provide financial, educational, and livelihood assistance.

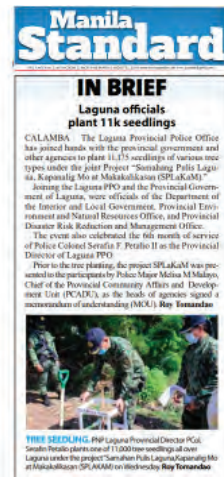
The timely and direct response of the Laguna Police Provincial Office to mitigate the adverse socio-economic implications of the global pandemic COVID-19 is the Pulis Laguna, Kapanalig Mo Project. Aside from this, the nominee also conceptualized and implemented numerous community outreach pro-

grams. These programs are Adopt-A-Family Program, Barangayanihan-Feeding/Kitchen Soup, “*Libreng Gupit Handog ng Kapulisan, Para sa mga Ama ng Tahanan*”, Eskwela On Wheels, Issuance of Travel Authority, and Barangayanihan-Ayuda and Gift-Giving Program. In total, these community programs have reached a third of the population of the entire Laguna province, amounting to at least a million residents.

The limitations brought by COVID 19 mirrors a more threatening neighborhood. Victims of domestic abuse and violence are experiencing increased difficulties in seeking help. The Laguna PPO observed a rise in the cases of domestic abuse especially in populated areas like Laguna and NCR as observed from TV and radio reports and the data of the Philippine National Police. It was an alarming increase that PCOL PETALIO II launched the project, Project PNP (PITO NI PETALIO): “*Silbato Para Sa Saklolo*”. An innovative pandemic response on crime prevention on gender-based violence incidents through the empowerment of women, teenagers, and children.

Lastly, the construction of General Paciano Rizal Park aims to respect and bring honor to the memory of the late hero. The objective of PCOL PETALIO II is to inspire patriotism and heroism amongst the community surrounding the park, its visitors, and the people of the Philippines as a whole. With the recognition of the National Historical Commission, General Paciano Rizal Park was declared a national historical site. The bestowment of the historical marker signifies that General Paciano Rizal Park will be safeguarded to preserve its historical heritage and significance even as the years pass by.

PCOL SERAFIN FORTUNO PETALIO II is indeed a professional public servant to the community with utmost devotion and dedication above personal interest and affirm unconditional service. He embodies the core values of the Philippine National Police through his projects and programs becoming a *Maka-Dios* (Pro-God), *Makabayan* (Pro-Country), *Makatao* (Pro-People) at *Makakalikasan* (Pro-Environment).

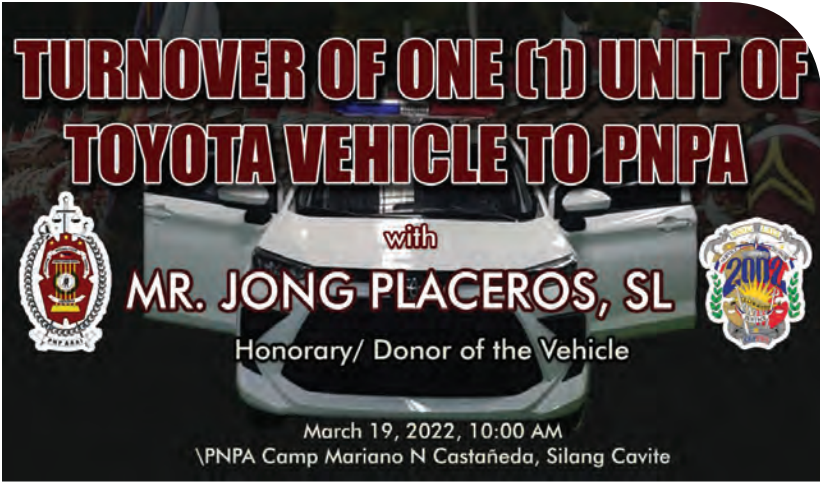
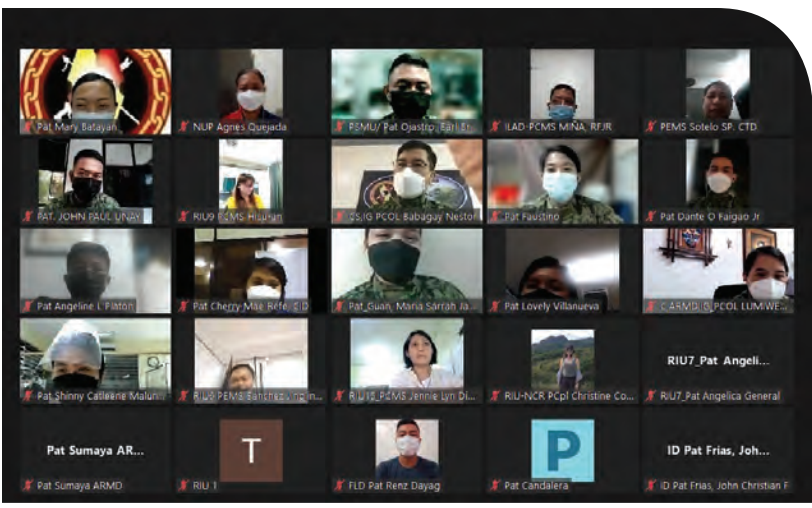

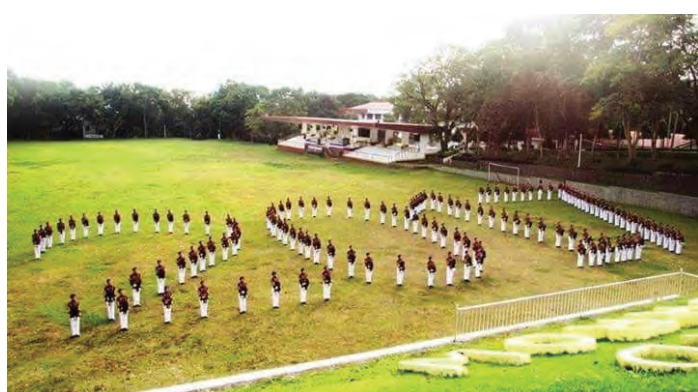
This time of the year once again allows us to rekindle our spirit and our aspirations, because it is our aspirations that will take us to the stars.

BFP Lakan during the Aftermath of Typhoon Odette

The aftermath of Typhoon Odette has brought devastation to the regions of Visayas and Mindanao. The Dinagat Islands, Surigao del Norte, and Surigao del Sur were the heavily affected provinces of the CARAGA Region. Its Regional Director, LAKAN F/SSUPT FRED L TRAJERAS JR, despite the endless rescue response operations he was leading, took the initiative to partner with the PNPAAI – BFP Chapter headed by its President LAKAN F/CSUPT BELINDA B OCHAVE in providing relief goods for the victims of the said typhoon. The said partnership led to the immediate provision of Php 100,000.00 worth of relief goods to the victims of the region. Directly supervising the distribution of the goods were the BFP –CARAGA Lakan, who dubbed the activity as the “E-Balde Initiative,” wherein all relief goods and hygiene kits were placed in buckets instead of plastic bags for better usage purpose. The distribution of the relief goods to the typhoon victims was also the Pamaskong Handog activity of the BFP-CARAGA Lakan carried out from December 26 -28, 2021.

BFP-NCR Regional Director LAKAN CSUPT GILBER D DOLOT

and BFP-NCR Lakan Chapter President and Assistant Regional Director for Admin LAKAN F/SSUPT JEROME T REANO also took the initiative of raising funds among NCR BFP Lakan for financial assistance to BFP Region 7 personnel who were victims of the typhoon. Along with this was the Manila Fire District Mobile Kitchen and Mobile Clinic deployment to various provinces of Region 7, which spanned from December 26, 2021, to January 11, 2022.

Recognizing that there were BFP Lakan that were also victims of typhoon Odette, PNPAAI – BFP Chapter President LAKAN F/CSUPT BELINDA B OCHAVE spearheaded the fundraising of funds as financial assistance for them through its Board Of Trustees. The fundraising was able to generate a total of Php 333,000.00, which were given to sixteen (16) BFP Lakan with varying assistance amounts depending on the scope of damage the typhoon has affected their homes. This collaborative effort from BFP Lakan nationwide truly sums up the lyrical phrase, “it’s a good thing to be a brother...”

This can be seen in the response the Chief of the BJMP has continuously led throughout the Bureau’s efforts during the COVID-19 crisis.

In fact, COVID-19 vaccination among PDL in district, city, and municipal jails across the country is almost complete. Isolation facilities were continuously monitored to ensure that more focused medical attention was given to patients while policies are recalibrated to meet the pressing needs in the field.

No end to this pandemic is yet seen. But the BJMP is hopeful that with Jail Director Allan Iral as the agency’s compass, with an intact system of prevention and management of the disease in the BJMP he caused to be established at the soonest possible time, and with the least cost and casualty, as can be managed, the Bureau is assured that there is no longer a reason for things to get worse. Instead, they will be better and more stable.

increased notably by 2.15% or equivalent to 94.83 %.

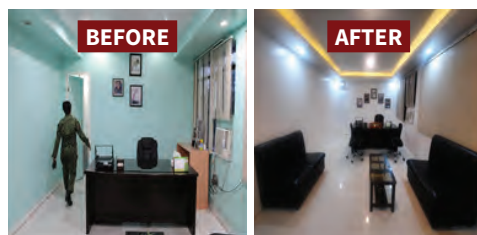

In 2015, then PSUPT SIASON, Commanding Officer of Sultan Kudarat Provincial Mobile Force Company (SKPMFC), gave his utmost support by providing intelligence and resources to the 84th Seaborne, SAF to in tracking down the whereabouts of the Most Wanted High-Value Target-International Terrorist identified as Zulkifli Abdhir (Zulkifli Bin Hir) also known as Marwan who was killed during a police operation in Mamasapano, Maguindanao on February 4, 2015.

While serving as Provincial Director of South Cotabato Provincial Police Office, PCOL SIASON continued to perform his duties involving anti-terrorism campaign which led to the Neutralization and Arrest of ranking leaders of Local Terrorist Group – Dawlah Islamiyah – SOCCSKSARGEN KATIBA (an I.S.I.S inspired Local Terrorist Group) operating in Region 12 and adjacent provinces in Mindanao.

CAMPAIGN AGAINST COMMUNIST TERRORIST GROUP

In 2013, then PSUPT SIASON took the lead of a team from the T’boli MPS, which launched a hot pursuit operation against suspected members of the CPP/NPA/NDF at Brgy. Sinolon, T’boli, South Cotabato on November 03, 2013. This resulted in the apprehension of Alexander Cadungan



Puertogalera alias Commander “Alex”/ “Toto”, Secretary of the Regional White Area Committee (RWAC).

PCOL SIASON was also responsible for the voluntary surrender of more than two hundred (200) members of the New People’s Army belonging to different Guerilla Fronts operating in Region 12. He successfully facilitated the surrender of said former rebels along with the release of Financial Assistance and other benefits through E-CLIP (Enhanced Comprehensive Local Integration Program).

ANTI-ILLEGAL DRUGS OPERATIONS

He led a series of successful anti-illegal drugs operations, eradication of Marijuana plantation, dismantling of ‘Shabu’ *tiangges*, and the implementation of a warrant of arrest in different areas in Region 12, which resulted in the seizure of illegal drugs with an estimated total value based on the Dangerous Drugs Board value amounting to fifty million pesos (P50, 000, 000.00) and a recovery of assorted firearms and ammunition.

SIGNIFICANT POSITION AND ASSIGNMENT

He held various positions and assignments including his designation as Provincial Director of South Cotabato Police Provincial Office in 2019-2020; Chief, Regional Operations and Plans Division, PRO 12 in 2018-2019; Deputy Senior Police Assistant to the Secretary DILG in 2016, and Commanding Officer of Sultan Kudarat Provincial Public Safety Company (SKPPSC) in 2015-2016 among others.

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

PCOL SIASON completed his Masters degree in Public Administration from Polytechnic University of the Philippines in December 2005.

His training includes the SAF-Basic Airborne Course; The Conduct of Humanitarian Relief Operation; SWAT Instructor’s Course; Strategic Negotiation and Conflict Management; Peace and Development Executive Course, United Nations Police; Terrorist Crime Scene Investigation Course, FBI, Quantico, and Virginia, U.S.A. among others.

AWARDS AND RECOGNITIONS

His notable awards include the Outstanding Filipino – Country’s Outstanding Police Officer in Service (COPS) in 2016; Best Senior Police Commissioned Officer for Operations in 2021; United Nations Service Medals in Sudan, Kosovo, and Darfur; PNPA Model Employee and Tactical Officer in 2005; United Nations Certificate of Excellence (Darfur) in 2010; PNP Outstanding Achievement Medals; PNP Heroism Medals and among others.

With his initiatives and accomplishments which drew the breakthroughs for awards and recognition, PCOL SIASON attributed the success on its strategy which he coined: J.E.M.U.E.L (Just Executing Management Unveiling Excellent Leadership) approach.

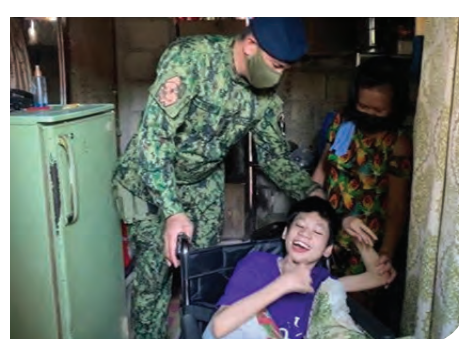
In line with this, PCOL LAMBERT A SUERTE has been proving that his sworn duty weighs more than his fear of this virus and its limitations as human beings.

He himself was the one who personally conceptualized the project. Along with RMFB and stakeholders, he visualized Gulong ng "Suerte" to be a liberating project not just for the recipients but also for their families.

"Gulong ng Suerte" aims to provide brand-new wheelchairs for PWDs who belong to the less privileged sectors of society. Simply put, the beneficiaries of this project are those who have no means of providing wheelchairs for their loved ones who suffer from mobility restrictions caused by their individual health conditions.

To stress, its chief desire is to provide assistance to PWD who belongs to the poorest among the poorest families in different communities of NCR where left-leaning sectoral groups were reported to be organizing and mobilizing masses for their evil cause. It is perceived that through this activity, police are sending a clear message to the citizenry that even the police force can be a channel of government social services, that their presence is not just for

The “One Wheelchair Per Month Schedule” did not go as planned because surprisingly, the giant of unbelief and doubts in sustaining this program fell as RMFB receives overwhelming support and commitments from their partners and stakeholders.

Indeed, the project vehemently lives up to its numerous philanthropic activities that benefits the community even outside its jurisdiction such as Quezon Province, Rizal , Bulacan, Cordillera, Nueva Vizcaya, La Union, Pangasinan, and Marawi. The

RMFB force rolled to Brgy Papandayan, Caniogan, Marawi City, and Lanao Del Sur in December 2021 to deliver services, food packages, and presents to the people who are in dire need.

“Gulong ng Suerte” was made out of from hearts and not just from the minds and deeply seated on compassion which should be the very nature of every public servant. This is the driving force in order to reach out to more people! The compassion in serving the people beyond expectation is significant in building and keeping the peace in the region and country as a whole!

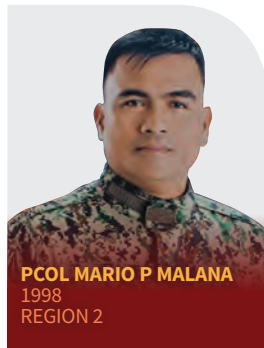
